Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder reports that she has not cared for children since her last inspection. She has not maintained the spaces available for caring for children. Neither the playroom or garden are suitable for children to use.
- The childminder does not have appropriate arrangements in place to maintain the documents required for the safe and efficient running of her service. She was unable to provide the required documents for inspection.
- The childminder has not kept her knowledge and understanding of the requirements for the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' current. She has a poor understanding of the learning and development requirements and does not demonstrate the knowledge needed to provide suitable educational programmes for children.
- The childminder does not have good enough arrangements in place to keep children safe. She does not have an up-to-date awareness of safeguarding issues or the procedures to follow should she have concerns about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder has a current paediatric first-aid certificate.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

The provision is not meeting requirements and Ofsted intends to take enforcement action.

We will issue a Welfare Requirements Notice requiring the provider to:

- The inspector discussed the safety and suitability of the premises with the childminder.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the how to support children's learning.
