

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On the 27 July 2022, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements.

On the 28 September 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 13 October 2022:

- ensure individuals working with children have ongoing training, knowledge and skills to fulfil the requirements of their role
- monitor staff to assess the quality of work and take steps to address any weaknesses so there is assurance they are competent in the work they undertake
- ensure the available areas for minded children in the premises meets the square metre indoor space requirements
- implement effective risk assessment to ensure all reasonable steps have been taken to

mitigate hazards so children are not at risk with particular regard to existing health conditions of individuals

- ensure you notify Ofsted of changes with particular regards to individuals that are no longer associated to the registration and changes of circumstances with household members.

On the 11 October 2022, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had reviewed and taken steps to address each action and improve aspects of the provision so there is a more robust approach to risk assessment and monitoring of practice. This is to demonstrate staff have an improved and secure understanding in how to fulfil the requirements of their roles and responsibilities. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
