

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 16 September 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

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Actions needed by 24 October:

- put an effective key-person system in place so that the individual needs of children are consistently met
- take steps for staff who have lead responsibilities to develop a suitable
- understanding of their roles and responsibilities and the early years foundation requirements suitable
- ensure that there is always at least one member of staff on the premises with a current paediatric first-aid certificate
- ensure effective systems are in place to provide staff with support and training to help them to understand their roles and responsibilities
- ensure arrangements are in place to swiftly support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities so that prompt action can be taken to help all children make the best possible progress
- ensure that all adults working with children have their suitability checked.
- take steps for staff who have lead responsibilities to develop a suitable understanding of

their roles and responsibilities and of the early years foundation requirements

- ensure that all adults working with children have their suitability checked
- ensure that there is at least one member of staff on the premises at all times with a current paediatric first-aid certificate
- ensure arrangements are in place to swiftly support children with SEND so that prompt action can be taken to help all children make the best possible progress
- ensure effective systems are in place to provide staff with support and training to help them to understand their roles and responsibilities.

We suspended the provider's registration on 16 September 2022, because we believed children may be at risk of harm. Suspension allows time for the provider to take steps to reduce or eliminate the risk of harm to children.

On 7 October 2022, the provider notified us of their wish to resign their registration. Consequently, on 12 October 2022, we lifted the suspension to allow us to resign their registration. They are no longer a registered childcare provider.
