Overall outcome

The school is likely to meet the relevant independent school standards if the material change relating to the school provision is implemented

Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 11, 12 and 16

- The single central record shows that appropriate employment checks have been carried out on the staff who have already been appointed.
- The safeguarding policy is suitable. It is detailed and takes account of the most recent statutory guidance. The policy is appropriately linked to other documentation, including the risk assessment policy, the first-aid policy and the health and safety policy.
- The proprietor body has ensured that there is a suitable suite of health and safety policies that are written to ensure compliance with the relevant laws. Appropriate records of health and safety checks are in place. Suitable health and safety checks have also been carried out to ensure that the proposed new premises is compliant with all relevant legislation and regulations.
- The proprietor body ensures that the school complies with all the fire-safety regulations. Very recently, leaders have carried out additional checks on fire equipment to ensure that it is in an appropriate condition for the proposed new site. Fire evacuation procedures are also in place. There is suitable signage throughout the proposed site, which can be easily followed in the event of a fire.
- The proprietor body has an acceptable risk assessment in place for fire. This identifies any potential risks to the safety of pupils with the aim to manage and minimise these risks. Fire risks in the proposed new premises have been appropriately considered.
- The proprietor body's written policy on risk assessment and risk management is compliant. Risk assessments are in place for a wide range of activities and for the use of the new building.

The school's proposed new premises were previously used as a Bible study hall. The proprietor has carried out building works to make the premises suitable for use as a school. These proposed new premises include four classrooms, a school library, a medical room and toilets. There is outdoor space adjacent to the proposed new school building.

- All building work has been completed to a high standard. Leaders have invested in resources to make sure that the new building is suitable for use as a school. For example, the furniture is suitable for the intended age range and numbers of pupils. Engaging displays are ready in classes.
- There is a suitable amount of classroom spaces for the intended number of pupils. There are four classrooms. They are appropriate for the requirements of the intended curriculum. They are suitable to ensure the welfare and safety of pupils. Acoustics in learning spaces are also appropriate.
- The toilets and medical room are satisfactory. Classrooms, corridors and shared areas, such as the communal room, are well lit. External lighting has been installed for the playground and the entrance to the school. Leaders have fully considered the arrangements for pupils entering and leaving the site at the start and end of the school day.
- Drinking water is clearly labelled. Bottled water is available for pupils. Washing facilities are also available throughout the building. The temperature of the hot water does not pose a scalding risk.
- Pupils have access to a suitable outside space for play within the proposed new premises. Pupils will access local leisure facilities for physical education sessions. Leaders have risk assessed travel to and from the venue.
- The proprietor body has ensured that all the independent school standards in this part are likely to be met.

Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

- Leaders prioritise the welfare, health and safety of pupils. They have experience of working with vulnerable pupils and they demonstrate the knowledge appropriate to their roles. Leaders have ensured that all health and safety standards are likely to be met.
- The proprietor body and leaders have ensured that all the independent school standards in this part are likely to be met.
