Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates that she knows how to plan an exciting curriculum. For example, she talks about how she plans the activities linked to children's interests, such as in books like 'The Gingerbread Man'. She describes how she includes all areas of learning in activities.
- The childminder understands the importance of children having fresh air and exercise. For instance, she talks about providing opportunities for children to develop their physical skills while on outings to the local park. She describes opportunities to teach children to safely manage risks, such as when learning to climb on equipment.
- The childminder recognises the importance of parent partnerships. For instance, she talks about the importance of keeping parents informed of children's progress. This ensures that families feel valued, which builds positive relationships.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of how to promote children's good behaviour. For example, she talks about the need to be a positive role model and support and guide children in a gentle manner.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping her knowledge and understanding up to date through training. Through discussion, she describes how she also established strong links with local schools. This helps ensure that appropriate information is shared to promote continuity for children.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding. For instance, she knows the signs and symptoms of abuse and who to contact if she suspects a child maybe at risk of harm. This ensures that children are kept safe.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
