Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Managers and staff have a secure understanding of how to keep children safe. They know the potential signs and symptoms which could indicate that a child is at risk of harm. Staff are clear about the correct procedure to follow if they have concerns about a child's welfare or if they need to report an allegation about a colleague. Managers ensure that there are robust risk assessments in place and expect staff to adhere to them to ensure children are safe and secure when at the after-school club.
- Managers and staff are passionate about children learning to adopt a healthy lifestyle. They plan to address this by providing daily opportunities to be active and enjoy the fresh air. Staff intend for children to learn and practise skills associated with different sports, such as dribbling a ball with a hockey stick. Children will be provided with healthy, nutritious food and have the opportunity to talk about their favourite foods.
- Managers and staff comment on their commitment to putting children at the centre of their practice. They plan to welcome children's feedback on their experiences at the after-school club. Each child will be provided with their own 'passport' books. They can share their thoughts and views about things that have gone well and not so well in these books. Staff plan to follow this up to ensure that children feel that their thoughts matter.
- Managers and staff know that after a full day at school, children need the opportunity to unwind, share their experiences about their school day and engage in activities that captivate their attention. Staff plan to introduce new imaginative sports games and craft ideas on a regular basis, to help keep children motivated. As part of these activities, there will be opportunities to raise children's awareness of health initiatives. For example, activities around 'peace week', to help them understand about fairness and fostering an atmosphere of mutual respect.
- Managers and staff understand the need to promote a consistent level of care from school to the after-school club. They plan to establish a clear communication process between school staff and themselves to help support children's emotional well-being while at the club. Staff intend to develop a strong partnership with parents, who will have the opportunity to share their views about the provision on offer.
- Staff have high expectations for children to maintain good behaviour. They intend to do this by starting the session with 'welcome time' to make children aware of the rules and why they are in place. Managers and staff expect children to have respect for the environment, equipment and each other.
- Managers already have an established recruitment and induction process in place. They understand the significance of ensuring that all staff are suitable to work with children. Managers intend to conduct regular appraisals with each staff member, which will help to identify any gaps in knowledge. To address staff's ongoing professional development, they have access to a selection of online and face-to-face training opportunities.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to managers and staff to understand their vision for meeting young children's needs.
- The inspector looked at relevant documents, including evidence of all staff's suitability to work with children.
- The inspection had a tour of the premises to ensure it is safe and secure for young children.
- Although there were no children in the early age range present at the time of this inspection, there were children present who were over the age of five years.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
