

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On the 6 October 2022, although the provider notified us of a significant event, this was not within the timescales set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage and is a breach of requirements.

On 20 October 2022, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued an action for the provider to take.

Actions needed by 2 December 2022:

- demonstrate effective systems for notifying Ofsted and/or other agencies with statutory responsibilities for safeguarding without delay.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our

responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
