

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 September 2022, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 5 October 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 28 October 2022:

- make sure the daily record of the arrival and departure times of children is consistently maintained
- make sure that all staff caring for children hold a full and current paediatric first aid certificate, particularly those who are in sole charge of children for any period of time
- improve the organisation of records so that they are easily accessible and available for the inspector to view on request.

On 1 November 2022, we visited the provider to check whether the provider had made improvements to meet the actions that were set. We found that the provider had improved their daily record of the arrival and departure times of children and has maintained this record to ensure it is accurate and fully completed. The provider has also ensured that staff, particularly those in sole charge of children for any period of time, hold an appropriate paediatric first aid certificate. The provider has improved the organisation of the documentation she holds to ensure that records are easily accessible and available for viewing by an inspector during an inspection or visit.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The

provider is still registered with Ofsted.

## **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
