Overall outcome

The school meets all of the independent school standards that were checked during this inspection

Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 7(a), 7(b)

- The new school leadership team has a clear oversight of safeguarding. Its members demonstrated how they work collaboratively with staff, pupils and parents and carers to regularly review procedures to ensure that they continue to meet the need of all pupils.
- Leaders attend regular safeguarding training alongside other independent school leaders. They meet regularly with the local authority safeguarding leader and have good working relationship with their local social care team.
- Leaders understand the different processes in place across the various local authorities that serve the pupils who attend this school. This supports leaders' detailed focus on safety and safeguarding for all pupils, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).
- Leaders demonstrated how they actively seek to reflect on, review and improve their processes and were able to share examples of where they had completed this successfully.
- All staff receive regular safeguarding training. The designated safeguarding leads use regular guizzes to check that staff have understood this training.
- The independent school standards (the standards) in this part were met at the previous inspection and remain met.

- The administration manager ensures that all appropriate recruitment checks are carried out promptly. These are recorded on the single central record. The single central record is up to date. It is compliant with the relevant legislation and guidance.
- The school administrator has successfully completed safer recruitment training.
- The standards in this part were met at the previous inspection and continue to be met.

Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

Paragraphs 28(1), 28(1)(d)

- At the previous inspection, the temperature of hot water, at the point of use in some taps, posed a risk of scalding to users.
- These taps are now fitted with thermostatic measurement valves. This ensures that the hot water no longer presents a risk of scalding.
- The site manager checks the water temperature levels each month and records this. The temperature in the hot water storage tank is checked, along with the temperature of hot and cold water at the point of use. Records show that water temperatures at all three points have remained within the recommended levels since the valves were installed.
- This previously unmet standard is now met.

Part 6. Provision of information

Paragraphs 32(1), 32(1)(c)

- The child protection and safeguarding policy was due to have been reviewed in May 2022. This review was postponed due to the arrival of a new headteacher. The policy available online at the start of the inspection was out of date.
- During the inspection, school leaders updated the website with an interim safeguarding policy. This is available on the school's website for parents to access. This policy pays regard to the most recent guidance issued by the Secretary of State.
- This standard was met at the previous inspection and continues to be met.

- This school was last inspected in January 2022. This was a standard inspection carried out under section 109(1) and (2) of the Education and Skills Act 2008.
- At the school's previous standard inspection in January 2022, it was judged good in all areas.
- Since the previous standard inspection, the chair of trustees has changed.
- A new headteacher took up post in September 2022. She is leading the school alongside the education manager, who will leave this post in December 2022.

- The school has employed a new administration manager and a new special educational needs coordinator (SENCo) since the previous inspection.
- The school follows the Steiner Waldorf curriculum. It accepts pupils aged from age three to 14 years.
- The school does not use any alternative provision.



Information about this inspection

- The previous standard inspection took place in January 2022, when the school was judged not to meet one of the requirements of the independent school standards.
- This was the first monitoring inspection to take place.
- The inspection was conducted without notice.
- Inspectors met with the headteacher, the education manager, the school administration manager, the SENCo and the site manager. The inspector also met with the chair of trustees.
- The inspector reviewed safeguarding and SEND documentation, checked the school's processes for the safer recruitment of staff, reviewed the school's systems for acting on safeguarding concerns, talked to a range of staff, completed a tour of the school and checked the hot-water facilities.
