

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 October 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 7 November 2022 and 29 November 2022, we carried out regulatory visits. The focus of each visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

At the visit on 7 November 2022, we found that adult: child ratio requirements were being adhered to, children were being adequately supervised and their care needs were being met. All areas of the building that children could access had been risk assessed and hazards removed. Additionally, food preparation areas were fully equipped with the necessary equipment to make sure good food hygiene practices can be maintained. We found that staff had received induction training and knew the procedure to follow in the event of a fire or any other emergency. Furthermore, all fire exits were clear of obstacles which could hinder the safe evacuation of children.

At the visit on 29 November 2022, we found that effective systems had been set up to enable a two-way flow of information with parents, so that they had a full understanding of the care their child receives. We found that staff were receiving effective coaching and mentoring which was having a positive impact on how well they were implanting the curriculum, and keeping children engaged in learning.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

On 9 November 2022, the provider notified us of an incident. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of serious accidents that children sustain.

On 16 November 2022 and 22 November 2022, we carried out regulatory telephone calls. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has improved the organisation of transitions between rooms to ensure children's safety.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
