Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a thorough knowledge of how to support children's learning. For example, using observations and assessment to help her identify what children know, can do and their progress. This includes the progress check for children at age two. She clearly understands how to use this information to help her provide the right curriculum for individual children. The childminder knows how to design suitably ambitious and enjoyable experiences to encourage children's learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's language skills. For instance, children who speak English as an additional language. She clearly demonstrates a broad range of techniques she will use to encourage children's communication and language.
- She confidently discussed the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. She knows to provide parents with information about their children to enable them to support and extend children's learning at home.
- The childminder understands the value of promoting children's independence, confidence, and self-esteem. She knows how to effectively support children to build secure relationships and help them develop strong social skills. The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children to understand simple rules and boundaries. She knows the value of praising children to help them develop positive behaviour and how to manage their own emotions.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of rigorous risk assessment. For instance, she ensures that all adults living in the household are consistently suitable. She completes checks of her home and outings to ensure children are safe and secure in her care.
- The childminder knows the value of evaluating her practice and provision. She identifies her strengths, areas for improvement and attends relevant training to help her improve.
- The childminder recognised the importance of providing healthy snacks for children. She knows the importance of daily outdoor play to help support children's physical skills, promote their good health and well-being.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the signs and symptoms that might indicate a child may be at risk of harm or abuse. She knows the procedures to follow to safeguard children's welfare.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector took into account written feedback from parents.
