Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is clear about the signs of possible abuse and is confident about the processes to follow, should she have concerns about children's welfare. She has a secure knowledge of what to do if an allegation is made about her or a member of her household.
- The childminder knows her responsibility to provide a safe learning environment for children. She explains how she will minimise or eliminate hazards through regular checks and risk assessments. The childminder describes how she will teach children to keep themselves safe, such as when crossing roads.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. For example, she says she will gather details of children's care routines and use this information to help them settle and feel secure.
- The childminder has a range of suitable resources for children and explains how she will promote their learning and development. She knows how to make regular assessments of children's progress and use the information to plan a range of challenging and exciting activities.
- The childminder understands the importance of healthy lifestyles for children. She discussed how she will provide daily fresh air and exercise, such as through visits to parks. She describes how she will work with parents to provide nutritious meals and snacks for children.
- The childminder explains how she will broaden and enrich children's experiences. For example, she plans to take them on outings, such as to the local library and playgroups, to help them learn about their environment and community.
- The childminder describes her high expectations for children's behaviour. She explains how she will be a good role model and promote good manners and kindness towards others.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice. She explains how she will consult with parents and children, to help identify how she can develop her provision. The childminder has developed links with other childminders, to share ideas on good childcare practice.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
