Overall outcome

The school is likely to meet the relevant independent school standards if the material change relating to the school provision is implemented

Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraph 7–7(b)

- These independent school standards (the standards) were met when the school was inspected in March 2022. Inspectors judged safeguarding to be effective.
- An up-to-date safeguarding policy is available on the school's website. Leaders ensure that staff are trained to understand and follow this.
- Leaders deal with safeguarding concerns appropriately. Leaders log cases thoroughly, such as the occasional use of restraint, and use their processes consistently. They carefully monitor the well-being of pupils who are at risk of harm. For example, leaders support any pupils who are perpetrators of abuse or harassment to help them develop more positive attitudes. When leaders need to liaise with outside agencies, they do this regularly and promptly, as shown by referrals to the local authority designated officer and children's services.
- The proprietor body oversees leaders' work on safeguarding effectively. Governors check closely on safeguarding. The proprietor body has regular meetings with leaders and staff about incidents and makes sure any referrals to agencies are made as needed.

Paragraphs 11, 12, 16

■ The proprietor body has ensured that there is a detailed health and safety policy in place. Staff receive the training they should. Health and safety is embedded in the management of the site, such as checks on gas safety and legionella's disease. The processes and risk assessment for fire safety are appropriate and up to date. Risk assessments show that leaders plan closely and regularly how to keep pupils and the site safe.

Paragraph 14

■ The proprietor body ensures that there is an appropriate number of staff with responsibility for safeguarding. Leaders make sure staff are given the training they need, for example to know how to ensure the local arrangements and independent school standards are met. The planned numbers of staff would be appropriate to



ensure suitable supervision of pupils if the increase in pupil numbers is granted.

■ The standards in this part are likely to be met.

Part 4. Suitability of staff, supply staff, and proprietors

Paragraphs 18(2)-21(7)(b)

- These standards were met when the school was inspected in March 2022.
- Leaders continue to make the checks they should on new, current and supply staff. The safeguarding policy has been amended to consider the most recent guidance on safer recruitment. Leaders show they have the knowledge required to complete appropriate recruitment and selection procedures effectively when appointing new staff.
- The proprietor body checks on the accuracy of the single central record.
- The standards in this part are likely to be met.

Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

Paragraphs 23(1)–31(c)

- These standards were met when the school was inspected in March 2022.
- The additional premises are situated on the same site. The new accommodation consists of classrooms, toilets and outdoor space for pupils to use for recreation. The classrooms are appropriate for the requested increase in number and age range of the pupils. Classrooms are well ventilated. Acoustics and lighting are appropriate. The facilities are sufficient and suitable if the proposed increase in the number of pupils on roll is granted.
- The spacious site is safe and tidy. There is a wide range of well-maintained recreation spaces. All stairwells and corridors are appropriately lit and free from clutter. Drinking water is available to pupils throughout the site. The temperature of the water for handwashing does not pose a scalding risk. The medical room is situated on the ground floor and is suitably resourced. There are suitable toilet and changing facilities available.
- The standards in this part are likely to be met.

Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

Paragraph 34(1)–34(1)(b)

- Leaders ensured that all the standards were met when the school was inspected in March 2022.
- The proprietor body makes sure that leaders and staff know the independent school standards well. Leaders check regularly on compliance. The proprietor body brings in external partners to give them assurance that the standards are being met.
- The proprietor body has the knowledge, skills and understanding to ensure that the health, safety and welfare of pupils are maintained should the proposed changes be granted.
- Leaders have ensured that all the standards are likely to be met.

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Compliance with regulatory requirements

The school is likely to meet the requirements of the schedule to the Education (Independent School Standards) Regulations 2014 ('the independent school standards') and associated requirements that are relevant to the material change.
