Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The managers know how to plan a range of experiences to engage children in their play. They provide routine circle times and games daily for children to take part in. Children are allocated free time to independently make choices about the activities they want to be involved in.
- The managers are aware of their responsibility to ensure children receive good levels of supervision to help keep them safe. Risk assessments are routinely carried out to ensure the environment is suitable to keep children safe.
- The managers, through discussion, demonstrate the importance of establishing partnerships with school staff to help contribute to the continuity of children's well-being.
- The managers are aware of how to promote children's physical health. For example, children have daily opportunities for outdoor play during the session all year round. Children will have access to nutritious meals and snacks daily, which consist of a selection of fruit, wraps or bagels with a choice of healthy fillings.
- The managers understand how to positively manage children's behaviour. Staff are responsible for giving clear guidance about expected behaviour. For example, children are encouraged to share, play well together and take turns.
- Procedures are in place for the safer recruitment and selection of staff. Systems ensure all staff are fully vetted prior to caring for the children. The managers are aware of their responsibility to implement effective procedures to support staff's ongoing professional development. Induction and appraisal procedures ensure staff have the appropriate skills, first-aid qualification and training to fulfil their role.
- The managers verbally demonstrate an appropriate understanding of their responsibility to safeguard children, which includes a knowledge of whistle-blowing procedures. They recognise the signs and symptoms that might indicate a child is at risk from harm or abuse. Staff receive regular safeguarding training. They know the procedures to follow if they have any concerns regarding a child's welfare.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The acting manager showed the inspector around the club areas and explained how the play environment is organised.
- The inspector had several discussions with the managers to explore leadership and management issues. She reviewed a sample of documentation. This included staff suitability checks, registers, insurance and the qualifications of staff working with the children.
- The inspector and the acting manger discussed and looked at toys, books, resources and equipment that are available for use.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
