

# Childminder report

## Summary of key findings

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder demonstrates little regard for the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. Although she took action to meet specific legal requirements following the previous inspection, the childminder has failed to sustain all the required improvements. This particularly relates to ensuring Ofsted can complete legally required suitability checks. Additionally, further safeguarding and welfare requirements are now not met. Consequently, children's safety and welfare are compromised.
- The childminder has failed to notify Ofsted of newly recruited assistants. This means Ofsted are unable to complete relevant checks to determine the suitability of adults currently working with children. The childminder confirmed she is aware of the risk this poses. She feels she manages this by ensuring unchecked staff work under her supervision. However, the lack of checks significantly compromise children's safety.
- Professional development is poor. The childminder has not updated her knowledge of child protection since her registration with Ofsted. This means there are gaps in her understanding of some child protection matters. The childminder is aware of the procedure to follow in the event of an allegation being made against herself, staff, or a member of the household. However, she does not have a secure understanding of the procedure to follow in the event of a child arriving with an existing injury. This places children at risk.
- The childminder has failed to provide the required child protection training for staff. This means some staff do not have an up-to-date knowledge of child protection issues. Additionally, they do not have a secure knowledge of the procedure to follow if they have any concerns about a child's welfare or the conduct of adults working with children.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates that she can effectively identify potential hazards to children's health and well-being. However, she has failed to take sufficient action to address the potential risk posed by the ongoing water damage that has caused mould in her home. This compromises children's good health.
- The childminder has a sufficient knowledge of the learning and development requirements. Through discussion, she demonstrates how she complements children's time in a maintained nursery.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to promote good behaviour through positive reinforcement. She explains how she uses 'house rules' to help children learn about the importance of socially acceptable behaviour.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's emotional well-being and their personal development. Through discussion, she demonstrates how she provides an inclusive service, where children can learn to value and respect one another.



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What does the setting need to do to improve?

The provision is not meeting requirements and Ofsted intends to take enforcement action.
