

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 31 October 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements. Following the inspection, on 25 November 2022 we served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 09 December 2022:

- improve the arrangements for supporting children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)
- ensure that all staff receive relevant training to understand their roles and responsibilities
- ensure that staffing arrangements and deployment meet the needs of all children throughout the day
- improve risk assessment and take all reasonable steps to ensure that children are not exposed to risks

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 15 December 2022, we monitored the provider's compliance with the above actions. We found that the provider had taken appropriate steps to remove risks from the environment and staff have received training to ensure they can recognise risks to keep children safe. Managers and staff have received coaching and support to understand their roles and responsibilities to carry out their role. The special educational needs coordinator (SENCO) has received training and guidance to ensure that appropriate arrangements are in place to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. Appropriate measures have been taken to ensure that staff are suitably deployed to meet the needs of the children.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
