

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 November 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 13 December 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had taken sufficient action to meet the actions raised in the welfare requirements notice. The provider demonstrates a positive attitude to making and maintaining improvements. The security of the premises has been improved to help prevent unauthorised persons entering. Staff implement effective procedures to keep the premises secure and when children are moving around the nursery. Leaders provide staff with appropriate support, training, and supervision to support them to fulfil their roles effectively. Staff receive ongoing training and one-to-one support to manage children's behaviour. Leaders have reviewed the key-person system and ensure that key persons provide tailored support to ensure children's individual needs are met.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
