Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder is breaching a requirement of the early years foundation stage. She has not renewed her paediatric first-aid certificate, which expired in June 2022, due to personal circumstances. However, the childminder has booked onto a future first-aid course to renew her certificate and refresh her knowledge. Through discussion, she demonstrates a secure knowledge of what actions to take in a medical emergency.
- The childminder's safeguarding knowledge is strong and she understands her roles and responsibilities in keeping children safe. She keeps her knowledge up to date through regular training refreshers. The childminder has a comprehensive understanding of the signs that a child may be at risk of harm and a vast array of child protection matters, such as radicalisation and online grooming. She understands the actions to take in regard to reporting a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder has attended various training to aid her understanding of the learning and development requirements. She understands early childhood education and is particularly passionate in teaching children the prime areas. She demonstrates understanding of how to observe, assess and plan for children's next steps to ensure they make healthy progression. She recognises the importance of identifying gaps in learning and getting children the additional help they need. She talks of the importance of parent partnerships and ensuring they are extending learning at home.
- The childminder is passionate about promoting good health and well-being through providing a vast array of nutritiously balanced meals and snacks. She discusses ways in which she will encourage children to be active, such as daily trips to the park, various cultures' traditional dancing and team games, such as football. She intends to teach children about growing their own foods and preparing their own meals to ensure they have this important life skill.
- The childminder endeavours to help children understand right from wrong, embed morals into their everyday life and ensure they learn how to become respectful to others. She discusses ways in which she will encourage and praise good behaviours and establish emotionally secure children. The childminder endeavours to include parents in the behavioural expectations set to ensure the child receives consistent support.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
