

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 1 December 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 12 January 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had taken steps to ensure that staff deployment is improved to ensure that children are always supervised, and had removed potential hazards from the premises to keep children safe. Children are no longer able to take food from other children's lunchboxes and the requirement to ensure that all children have opportunities to experience daily outdoor activities is now being met. Staff practice has improved regarding behaviour management, for example, through giving explanations for children about why some behaviour is not appropriate. Staff who are now special educational needs coordinators have attended training. The provider has held meetings with staff, and they have completed training that has helped them to improve their practice.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted
