Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The registered individual provided evidence that she has obtained the required Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks for staff. However, she has failed to keep a written record of the reference number, the date the check was obtained and details of who obtained it. This is a legal requirement that has not been met.
- The registered individual is also the manager and she works alongside the staff team daily. She has a secure understanding of how to provide a varied range of enjoyable experiences for children before and after school. There are effective systems in place to provide ongoing professional development opportunities for staff to help build on their skills and knowledge.
- The staff team attend regular safeguarding training. They have a secure knowledge about the possible signs of abuse and the procedure to follow if they have a concern about a child's welfare. There are effective systems in place to ensure staff receive a through induction and have a clear understanding of their roles and responsibilities. There are robust systems in place to ensure the indoor and outdoor environment is safe and suitable.
- The manager and staff value and understand the importance of working closely with parents. Staff use effective systems to obtain the necessary information required to help meet the needs of children. They collate information about any special dietary requirements and medical needs to help meet any specific needs.
- The manager and staff also work at the school during the day. They report this results in them getting to know children's unique personalities and friendship groups. They recognise the importance of working closely with staff from the onsite school to share information to help support children's education, care and well-being.
- The manager recognises the importance of continuous improvement. Staff daily reflect on their practice to help further develop experiences for children. They understand the value of obtaining the views of children through discussion and observation to help develop the activities on offer. Feedback questionnaires are used to obtain the views of parents and children and any suggestions considered and acted upon.
- The manager has a strong understanding of how to promote equality and diversity. Staff are confident in tackling any negative stereotypes about race, gender and disability and about the importance of teaching children to respect their differences.
- The manager understands how to promote positive behaviour. She recognises the significance of teaching children to learn to manage their feelings and help them develop positive attitudes.



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

There are three staff employed. Of these, one holds an early years qualification at level 3, one holds a qualification at level 1 and one is unqualified.

Inspection activities

- The inspector and the manager completed a learning walk together to check the safety of the premises and to gather information about the experiences provided.
- The inspector held a meeting with the manager. She looked at relevant documentation and evidence of the suitability of staff working at the club.
