

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 December 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 30 January 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their inspection.

We found that the provider has improved their knowledge and understanding of the risks associated with mobile phones. They have put appropriate measures in place to safeguard children. The provider has ensured that all staff have a clear understanding of their roles and responsibilities. Staff feel that there is effective support and supervision now in place particularly around supporting children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). The provider has ensured that there are risk assessments in place when carrying out off-site activities. They have improved their knowledge around possible risks and how to minimise these. The provider has ensured there are suitable arrangements in place to support children with SEND. This includes timely referrals and regularly reviewing children's individual education plans.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted
