

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 January 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection we served a welfare requirements notice on 02 February 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 19 February 2023:

- ensure a valid paediatric first-aid certificate is maintained at all times
- obtain up-to-date knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues and the responsibility to protect children from harm
- keep an accurate record of children's daily hours of attendance.

On 23 February 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved her knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities. She had maintained accurate registers of children's daily hours of attendance. The provider has completed paediatric first-aid training.



We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
