

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 19 January 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 31 January 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the manager had reviewed the deployment of staff and now ensures that sufficient staff are available to meet children's needs. Toilet doors have been fitted with glass panels and are fitted with sturdy catches to keep them open, so that staff can see any children inside. The manager ensures that sufficient staff are supervising children when other staff undertake household tasks. All staff have received training in behaviour management strategies to enable them to manage children's behaviour effectively. The manager has completed a full risk assessment of the premises and activities children take part in. Any risks have been identified and minimised or removed. Nappy changing facilities have been improved and are suitable and hygienic. The procedures in place for when a child has an accident have been strengthened. Staff are aware of the need to follow the nursery procedures to monitor the condition of any child following a head injury. The manager is providing ongoing training and support for staff to develop their practice and to ensure they are suitable to fulfil their roles and responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
