

## **Complaint about childcare provision**

## **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 26 January 2023, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 16 February 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed by 02 March 2023:

- ensure all staff understand the procedure to follow and who to contact in the event of an allegation against a member of staff
- implement a robust recruitment procedure, including suitability checks, to ensure only suitable people work with children

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 28 February 2023, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
