Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn. She knows how to plan activities to meet their interests and developmental needs and how to assess their progress. The childminder appreciates the value of providing children with a wide range of experiences to help broaden their horizons beyond the home. For example, she plans to take them on train rides, trips to the beach, soft-play centres and toddler groups.
- The childminder explains that she has high expectations for the children in her care. She describes her positive approach to supporting good behaviour and how she reinforces good manners and hygiene practices. The childminder talks about how she supports children's behaviour and emotional development. She understands how to teach children to share, be respectful and kind to one another.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing children with daily fresh air and a variety of opportunities to practise their physical skills and learn about healthy lifestyles.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows an understanding of the importance of building relationships with parents. For example, the childminder describes how she will communicate with parents through conversations.
- The childminder describes how she supports children to develop individually, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities. Through discussion, she describes how to refer to outside agencies for additional support with children's learning and development.
- The childminder keeps up to date with mandatory training, such as paediatric first aid and safeguarding.
- The childminder understands her safeguarding responsibilities to protect children from harm. She knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's well-being. The childminder attends regular safeguarding training. This helps to keep her knowledge current and to understand wider safeguarding issues that may affect children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
