

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 January 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements. We served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions set within the timescales set out.

On 7 March 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had improved systems to assure staff's knowledge and understanding of child protection, with particular regard to the 'Prevent' duty guidance and allegations made against staff or household members. The provider now fully understands their child protection responsibilities. Hygiene practices have been improved. Children are cared for in a premises that is fit for purpose and adequately heated. The provider has performance management systems in place to share knowledge of the curriculum with staff and to make sure it is successfully implemented.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
