

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2">www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2</a>. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 February 2023, the provider notified us that of a minor injury a child sustained while at the nursery.

On 3 March 2023 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider supported staff to understand their role when deciding where to deploy themselves to ensure children are supervised effectively. The provider made changes to how staff complete risk assessments with regards to areas to be checked and storage of play equipment.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

## **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
