Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder ensures that she, and any adults living in the household, have completed the necessary suitability checks with Ofsted. However, the childminder does not demonstrate that she has a clear knowledge of the requirement to inform Ofsted of all adults working with children on the premises. She has not notified Ofsted of assistants that she works with. Therefore, the required checks of assistants working with the childminder have not been checked by Ofsted to ensure they are suitable to fulfil the requirements of their roles.
- The childminder knows how to make her home into a safe, secure, and welcoming environment for children. She considers the play space well, ensuring it is free from hazards. Children have room to move and play safely.
- There is a wide range of interesting and age-appropriate resources for children to access. The childminder demonstrates her knowledge of child development through discussion. She explains clearly how she will provide activities to help children's learning. For example, she discusses how she uses art and craft materials to develop children's fine motor skills in preparation for writing.
- Discussion of the curriculum showed the clear intent of the childminder to provide a consistent routine to support children in their development of language and communication. The childminder discussed how the regular use of songs and stories can encourage children's speech. She described the importance of this as many children attending speak English as an additional language.
- Trips outside to offer new and exciting experiences are discussed by the childminder. She describes how outdoor experiences allow children to develop physical skills as they run, jump and balance. The childminder intends to visit toddler groups, where children play with peers, and learn to form friendships.
- The childminder describes how she supports children to manage their behaviour. She talks about role modelling good behaviour, and giving praise to encourage positive behaviour. The childminder explains how she would support children to think about their feelings and how others might feel.
- The childminder explains how she supports children with good hygiene routines, encouraging them to wash their hands well before meals and after using the toilet. She explains how she supports children to learn self-care skills. For example, putting on their own coats and shoes and feeding themselves at mealtimes. The childminder plans to support children to develop their independence to help them as they transition to school.
- The childminder has completed all her mandatory training. She discussed plans to build on her own professional development by reading and research of current topics.



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage, the provider must:
