Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider has a clear understanding of how young children must be supported. She knows the significance of working closely with schools to support children's learning with fun and educational activities. For example, the provider ensures staff understand how to communicate effectively with teachers and receive a verbal handover when they collect children. Through this, the provider intends that staff are equipped with sufficient knowledge to support children with homework, for instance, when they return to the setting.
- A key-person system is in place for younger children. The provider explains that in previous practice, this has enhanced how children have settled and interacted with older children. The provider strives to fully support children's well-being and personal development. For example, she knows the importance of encouraging children to complete tasks for themselves. The provider also understands how to deliver messages about leading a healthy lifestyle to children. For example, she understands the importance of fostering conversations around nutritious foods and how children limit screen time at home.
- The provider is clear on how to support children's behaviour in the setting. She has a strong ethos of kindness and explains how she would help children to play fairly together. If there are any concerns about children's behaviour, the provider understands the importance of working closely with teachers and parents, to implement consistent interventions that support children fully.
- The provider knows how to ensure the safety and welfare of children. She implements a robust safeguarding policy that she regularly reviews and makes available to parents. She knows how to recognise the signs and symptoms of different forms of child abuse and knows clearly how to report this. The provider can also explain the circumstances in which she may become concerned that a child has been subject to female genital mutilation. The provider ensures all staff that work directly with the children have received first-aid training.
- The provider knows the significance of teaching children about how to keep themselves safe. For example, staff know to include discussions about online safely during daily conversations and activities.
- Staff regularly complete professional development training. For instance, staff have recently completed a course about managing behaviour. The provider is supporting staff with their learning to enhance their knowledge and skills.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
