Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 4 November 2022, we carried out an inspection and found out that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 8 December 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit, and on 14 December 2022 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the visit and the call was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider met some actions. They took steps to ensure that all staff have up to date knowledge of safeguarding matters, including reporting procedures in line with the local safeguarding partners procedures. The provider also took steps to ensure that all emergency exits always remained free of obstruction.

However, through discussion with staff and leaders we found that some actions were still not met. This is because the manager and staff did not receive effective supervision, monitoring and coaching to help them understand their roles and responsibilities to improve the quality of education for children. Additionally, through observation we found that the provider did not ensure that children's behaviour was managed positively and in an appropriate way to support their well-being. Following this visit, the provider has resigned and is no longer registered with Ofsted.
