

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 August 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate requiring enforcement action.

Actions needed by 19 September 2022:

- plan and implement a curriculum that is broad, interesting, well resourced and appropriate for different children's ages and stages of development
- ensure a progress check is completed for all children between the ages of two and three, which includes the views of parents and any involved outside agencies.

We sent the provider a welfare requirement notice to comply with the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take actions within the timescales set out.

Actions needed by 19 September 2022:

- ensure that all staff have had relevant checks to confirm that they are suitable to work with children
- ensure risk assessments are effective so hazards can be swiftly identified and rectified in order to maintain a safe environment for children
- ensure all important information is swiftly shared with outside agencies, including children's social care, in order to effectively safeguard children
- ensure that the required necessary information is obtained for every child cared for by the setting, including their personal details and the details of who to contact in the case of an emergency
- ensure the manager and the deputy manager have sufficient training, skills and

knowledge required to fulfil their roles and responsibilities effectively and with integrity

- ensure staff are deployed effectively to meet the care and education needs of all children at all times, particularly with regards to babies and two-year-old children.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider informed us that they had closed the nursery meaning that Ofsted were unable to monitor the actions. The nursery has remained closed and the registration has since been cancelled.

The provider is no longer registered with Ofsted.
