Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is knowledgeable about safeguarding procedures. She knows the types of abuse and can recognise the possible signs and symptoms of abuse. The childminder has a safeguarding policy and knows how to make a referral about a child or an adult. She keeps accurate records of children's attendance and accidents. The childminder makes sure that she receives regular updates from the local safeguarding partnership.
- The childminder is friendly, calm and approachable and her setting is clean and well organised.
- The childminder describes how she will provide apparatus for children in her enclosed garden to develop their physical skills, such as climbing. She explains how she will consider all aspects of children's safety. The childminder explains the importance of supervising children at all times.
- The childminder's assistants are family members. She ensures that their suitability is checked and they have completed first-aid training. The childminder is passionate about early years education and care. She is knowledgeable about the early years foundation stage. The childminder explains how she will evaluate her practice and regularly participates in training. She describes how she shares new information with her assistants.
- The childminder explains how she has a routine which involves children walking to school each day and visiting parks and natural environments. She describes how she will promote children's healthy lifestyles, including having lots of exercise through physical play. The childminder discusses how children will have opportunities to sleep and eat a healthy and varied diet that includes fruit.
- The childminder discusses how she will develop good links with other professionals and the local school to support children's transitions.
- The childminder describes how she will build strong relationships with parents. She discusses how she will support diversity within her setting and the community. The childminder explains how she will gather information from parents to identify children's starting points in learning. She will find out what individual children like and recognises that children have different ways of learning. The childminder will offer children opportunities to experiment and enjoy new experiences.
- The childminder discusses the importance of modelling good manners and treating people with dignity. She explains how she will aim to give children the best start in life and values children.



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
