Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder describes how she continuously keeps her knowledge and understanding of the early years foundation stage and any relevant legislation up to date. She regularly attends various courses and completes her own online research for continuous professional development. The childminder explains how this helps her to know about the latest research in early years, what impact it could have on children and how she could help children to make better progress.
- The childminder demonstrates an excellent knowledge and understanding of how children learn and develop. She knows how to organise a variety of thoughtful and exciting activities that cover all areas of learning using children's ideas and interests to ensure this extends their interests, skills and abilities.
- The childminder understands the importance of effective relationships with parents and other settings that children attend in order to enable better knowledge about the child and to work in partnership.
- The childminder has thorough knowledge and understanding of safeguarding matters and how to keep children safe. She knows the correct procedures to follow when various child protection issues arise.
- The childminder is aware of the need to teach children about positive behaviour towards others, so that they learn to show respect and tolerance. The childminder describes what strategies she will use to help children try to problem-solve by themselves and take appropriate risks so that they can feel proud for themselves.
- The childminder has valid public liability insurance, as required.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
