# **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The provider is knowledgeable about how to implement the learning and development requirements and how to provide a service that complements children's learning at school. He successfully implements a range of policies and procedures and maintains required documents to successfully support their practice at the setting.
- The provider demonstrates that he has thorough knowledge of local safeguarding procedures and knows how to identify if a child is at risk of harm and how to report any concerns about a child's welfare. Furthermore, he knows how to promote children's safety at the setting. For instance, regular risk assessments are carried out to help to ensure that children play and learn in a safe environment.
- The provider understands how to support children's behaviour in a positive way. He discusses the importance of supporting children to develop their confidence, independence and self esteem. He explains how staff intend to develop respectful relationships and teach children about kindness, acceptance and tolerance.
- The provider recognises the importance of establishing close partnerships with parents and other professionals. He understands the value of sharing information to maintain a consistent approach to children's care and education.
- The provider understands his role in supporting children to lead active and healthy lifestyles. For instance, he discusses how children have daily opportunities for fresh air and to develop their gross motor skills during play. This helps to support children's overall health and well-being.
- The provider knows how to evaluate the provision and make plans to enhance the service on offer. He discusses the importance of continual professional development for staff to help them to keep their knowledge and skills up to date, particularly in relation to first-aid and safeguarding training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
