

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early year's providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundationstage-framework--2.

If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 06 March 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course.

Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 08 March 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 28 March 2023:

- implement a child protection policy and procedure which includes the actions to take when there are safeguarding concerns about a child, and in the event of allegation being made against anyone living or working on the premises

- improve knowledge and understanding of the signs that might indicate children are at risk of harm, including wider safeguarding matters, in line with the local safeguarding

partners guidance and procedures

- take action to ensure arrangements are put in place to consistently support all children with special educational needs and/or disabilities and are in line with special educational needs code of practice
- ensure relevant information is shared with parents and any other relevant professionals so that children's individual needs are met.

On 03 April 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities. In addition to this, the provider has arrangements in place to ensure children with special educational needs and/ or disabilities are consistently supported. Furthermore, arrangements are now in place to share information with parents and other professionals effectively.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
