

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 21 March 2023, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements and on the same date, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 5 April 2023, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has reviewed their risk assessment policies and procedures to include additional checks to ensure children in their care are not exposed to risks. The provider has also reviewed their medication policy to ensure medication is securely stored away and kept out of reach of children.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
