

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

Following an inspection that took place on 21 February 2023 we served a welfare requirements notice on 9 March 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed by 14 March 2023:

ensure relevant staff are alert to issues in a child's home life and elsewhere that are a potential safeguarding concern, and ensure staff know what to do if they believe a child may be exposed to radicalisation and extremism and if there is an allegation made against a colleague

ensure that all staff know how to recognise concerns about a child's welfare and when to make timely referrals to statutory safeguarding authorities, or follow up on referrals already made

ensure that all staff implement the risk assessments that are in place and that they can identify and eliminate any day-to-day risks to children

provide effective supervision of sleeping babies to ensure they are frequently checked on

put in place and consistently implement behaviour management strategies that are appropriate to the children's ages and particular needs

put in place and implement an effective key-person system to maximise information sharing with parents, provide secure and stable relationships between staff and children and support children's emotional needs

provide staff with appropriate training and guidance to ensure they have the skills and knowledge to understand and implement the curriculum and can accurately assess children's learning and development needs

implement effective arrangements to support the individual needs of children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) in accordance with the SEND Code of Practice.

On 21 March 2023, we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit. We found the provider had met the actions set. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted
