Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The directors do not have an effective safeguarding policy to inform their practice. They do not demonstrate a good understanding of their roles as the designated safeguarding lead. Understanding of statutory child protection roles and responsibilities is not up to date.
- The directors do not have a valid insurance in place. They describe how they will carry out daily risk assessments for the setting and during their walk to and from school. For instance, they plan to use a password for each family before adults are allowed to enter the building at the end of the day.
- The directors understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings children attend. They know the importance of gathering initial and ongoing information about children from parents and other professionals.
- The directors plan to explore the local community to extend children's learning experiences. They understand the importance of providing children with a range of play activities and opportunities to exercise and play in fresh air. For example, they explain how they will take regular trips to the park.
- The directors explain how they will keep their professional knowledge updated. They describe their recruitment process and how they will hold regular team meetings to support staff well-being and training.
- The directors know how to provide a varied and nourishing menu for children's breakfast and meals after school. They have a good understanding of how to meet the needs of children who have specific dietary requirements or food intolerances. The directors know how to promote positive behaviour.
- The directors know how they will promote children's well-being and hygiene. For instance, they know the importance of following daily routines, such as children washing their hands when they arrive at the setting and before meals.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.

- The inspector looked at the information and records available to check the vetting and suitability checks for all adults working on the premises.
- The inspector talked to the directors about their responsibilities to meet all requirements, including for safeguarding children.
