

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 Jan 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 13 Jan 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 27 January 2023:

- ensure that there are secure procedures to prevent unauthorised people entering the premises and an agreed procedure for checking the identity of visitors
- ensure effective policies and procedures are followed for the safe use of mobile phones
- take action to ensure that the environment is free from risks so that children can move around freely and safely.

On 30 January 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider has taken appropriate action to improve the security of the premise and checking the identity of visitors. The provider has made changes to the environment to minimise hazards. They have improved their risk assessments to include the safe use of mobile phones.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
