

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 March 2023, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 2 May 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 4 May 2023. These are legal notices that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 4 May 2023:

- ensure staff deploy themselves effectively and supervise babies adequately at all times to promote their safety and well-being.

On 10 May 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare action raised at their last inspection.

At this visit, we found that the provider has provided staff with support and coaching to help them fully understand their responsibilities to keep babies safe. Staff working in the baby room deploy themselves effectively. They always supervise babies well to enable any incidents to be identified and addressed swiftly, to promote babies' well-being and help keep them safe.

We are satisfied that the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised at their last inspection.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
