

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 January 2023, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We visited the provider on 16 January 2023 and issued them with a Notice to Improve. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action within the timescales set out.

Action needed by 31 January 2023:

implement appropriate and consistent behaviour management strategies to contribute to a positive learning environment and ensure children's behaviour is managed effectively.

On 30 January 2023, we received an action response letter. We found that the Notice to Improve had been met appropriately. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
