Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn and is able to explain how she will plan a broad and varied curriculum. She has a good knowledge of the different areas of learning and is able to describe the activities she would provide to promote children's development. She has experience of supporting children with special educational needs and/or disabilities and understands the need to adapt her approach to ensure all children make the best possible progress.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of her responsibility to safeguard children. She confidently explains the signs that may indicate a child is at risk of harm. She knows the action to take to share any concerns that she may have about a child in her care, should the need arise.
- The childminder has high expectations for children's behaviour. She explains how she will encourage children to be respectful, polite, have good manners and develop their social skills. She understands the importance of teaching children about people and cultures beyond their own. For example, she explains how she will teach children about the traditions and cultures of families from around the world.
- The childminder explains how she will provide the children with a wide range of opportunities to broaden their experiences and understanding of the world around them. For example, she describes how she would take children on outings to the library, garden centres and to visit local castles.
- The childminder recognises the benefits of working in partnership with parents. She describes how she will regularly share information with parents to keep them informed about their children's learning and development. She knows how she will include parents in evaluating her provision.
- The childminder keeps her knowledge and skills up to date. For instance, she seeks updates from the local authority. She also engages in professional development opportunities, such as attending training on autism spectrum disorder awareness.
- The childminder has risk assessments in place to ensure her home is safe and secure for children. She ensures that her home is very well maintained and cleaned to a high standard. The childminder explains how she would promote children's healthy lifestyles. For example, giving them plenty of opportunities for physical play and a healthy diet.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.



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
