

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 21 April 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection we served a welfare requirements notice on 27 April 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 5 May 2023:

- 1) ensure you have written permission to administer medicine and keep a written record each time medicine is administered to a child, and inform parents on the same day
- 2) ensure there are suitable hygienic changing facilities for changing children who are in nappies
- 3) take all reasonable steps to ensure children in your care are not exposed to risks
- 4) obtain all relevant information about individual children to help ensure every child's needs are met
- 5) implement and maintain a regular two-way flow of information between yourself and other settings that children may attend to ensure the needs of children are met

On the 12 May 2023 we carried out a regulatory monitoring visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had taken measures to meet the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of safeguarding procedures and has appropriate risk assessments in place. They have a clear procedure for the safe administration and recording of medication to children. They carry out effective nappy changing procedures which are hygienic and safe. They understand the importance of obtaining relevant information about all children in their care and now have this in place. They have met with other settings to

ensure there is a two-way flow of information to ensure the needs of children are met.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
