

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## **Summary of outcome**

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 4 May 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On the 24 May 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found the provider had met some of the safeguarding and welfare actions but not all. We have issued an action for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 7 June 2023

ensure all staff receive effective training and coaching so they have a clear understanding how to fully meet all aspects of their roles and responsibilities to include completing 2 year checks.



On the 6 June 2023, the provider responded to the actions set. We found the provider has made arrangements to offer training and support to staff to help improve their knowledge of the progress check at the age of two. This means key persons, with oversight from the manager, can complete the assessment to provide parents with a short summary about their children's progress. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
