The quality and standards of early years provision

Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The manager explains how staff will plan, gathering starting points to help plan for children's interests. He explains the staff will provide a wide range of varied resources to help children stay engaged and complement the seven areas of learning. He discusses that staff will work closely with the school teachers to complement children's learning and help them to gain future skills.
- The manager understands how to ensure that the premises are suitable for children who attend the club. There are a wide range of policies, procedures and risk assessments to help staff ensure that the school premises are safe and secure for children to use. He describes how staff will risk assess the areas children use and talk to them about how to manage their own safety.
- The manager is aware of his role to safeguard children. He explains how he will support staff to keep their safeguarding knowledge up to date, by attending regular training. He explains how staff are aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse, including radical and extreme views and behaviours and how to refer safeguarding concerns. The manager is familiar with local safeguarding partnership procedures.
- The manager understands the need to evaluate the provision. He explains how he provides opportunities for all staff to complete training courses and provides further coaching, should they require further support, to keep their knowledge up to date.
- The manager understands the importance of ensuring that staff have high expectations for children's behaviour. He is clear about how staff will be trained to manage a variety of behaviours to help children to develop positive relationships.
- The manager understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating, being physically active and spending time outdoors. For instance, children have access to a very large playground, where they can play ball games, such as football. Furthermore, they have opportunities to practice their balance and coordination skills, as they climb on large equipment.
- The manager understands the importance of developing close partnerships with parents and other professionals. He describes how staff talk to teachers at drop-off times so that staff have sufficient knowledge of the child's day at school. He explains that staff send regular newsletters, electronic communication and talk to parents about their child's time at the club at pick-up times.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector held a long discussion with the manager about the club's planning, activities on offer and childcare practices of the staff, to establish his understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The inspector took a tour of the areas that are used for children in the school building and held a discussion with the manager about the planning for children and checked the suitability of toys and resources available.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the public liability insurance and suitability for the staff and the adults working on the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
