

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 June 2023, the provider notified us of a significant event that occurred in the nursery. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 19 June 2023, we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit. We found that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider had completed thorough enquires into the incident. The provider had notified parents of the incident and had spoken to all staff to ensure procedures are consistently followed. In addition, amendments have been made to existing policies and procedures and adaptations have been made to one of the rooms, to ensure children are always within sight or hearing.

We also found that the provider was not meeting some other requirements.

Action needed by 4 July 2023:

- ensure accidents and injuries are recorded and reported accurately to parents on the same day as, or as soon as reasonably practicable after.

On 30 June 2023, the provider responded to the action raised. The provider has reviewed policies and procedures for reporting accidents and injuries and staff have completed training to ensure they understand these policies and procedures. Leaders have introduced new monitoring systems to ensure accident and injury forms are reported accurately to parents on the same day as, or as soon as reasonably practicable after.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
