## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Staff are aware of their duty to safeguard children. They complete regular safeguarding training and are confident to identify the signs and indicators of abuse. They understand the procedures to follow if they have any child protection concerns.
- Leaders demonstrate inclusive vision and practice. All staff have a robust knowledge and understanding of how to support vulnerable children, including children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- Staff have a close relationship with the host school. They greet children warmly as they arrive with their teachers. Teachers share with staff any updates or information about the children that they may need. Staff create an inclusive play environment and provide activities that interest all children and meet their individual needs well.
- The management team supports staff to undertake ongoing professional development and training opportunities to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- Effective communication systems with parents are in place. Parents share that staff know their children well and appreciate the varied range of activities available for their children to enjoy.
- All staff have a shared understanding of how to promote children's positive behaviour. They use regular praise and encouragement to acknowledge appropriate behaviour.
- Staff promote healthy lifestyles and care practices. They know how to support children to learn to manage their personal care needs, and they promote all children's health. For example, they provide nutritious snacks and ensure that all children's dietary and health needs are met.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
