## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The management team have made significant improvements since the last inspection. Staff have a good understanding of the role of the local authority designated officer and the external referral process should concerns be raised about an adult at the setting. They have a clear understanding of the signs of abuse, including wider safeguarding issues, such as female genital mutilation and internet safety.
- The management team have developed clear plans for the supervision and professional development of staff. They complete regular monitoring visits and are committed to ensure that all staff receive the training, coaching and support they need to fulfil their roles.
- Staff show a good understanding of how to support younger children. They explain how each child is assigned a key worker, and how they hold discussions with parents and teachers at the school to ensure continuity in their care and well-being.
- Staff describe how they seek the views of children. For example, children can express their thoughts and ideas through discussion or writing and posting them in a box. They can confidentially express how they feel about the club, such as through a red and green counter system.
- Staff explain how they listen to children's views and plan a range of activities based around their individual needs and preferences. They discuss how they ensure that resources are accessible to allow children to lead their own play.
- Staff explain the high expectations they have for children's behaviour. They demonstrate through discussion a good understanding of the importance of consistent approaches to behaviour management.
- Staff show a good understanding of how to promote children's health and well-being. They discuss how they provide children with a well-balanced tea and how this includes a range of healthy food options. They explain how they provide a variety of outdoor sports activities each day.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic with the regional operations director and has taken this into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector talked to the staff and members of the management team about the range of activities he provides for children, both indoors and outdoors.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including the suitability of staff, paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance.
- The inspector asked staff questions throughout the inspection to establish their understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The senior manager discussed her expectations for children's behaviour while attending the club.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
