## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have public liability insurance in place, which is a requirement of registration.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of how to safeguard children and can recognise a variety of signs and symptoms of abuse. She understands how to report her concerns about children's welfare to the appropriate agencies, such as the local safeguarding partnership.
- The childminder's home is safe and suitable for children. She understands the importance of regular risk assessments of the areas children may use, so that they can play safely. The childminder has a range of fire-safety equipment in place and has considered how she would leave her home in an emergency when caring for children.
- Through discussion, the childminder explains how she would identify what children know and need to learn next. She has suitable systems in place to monitor children's progress and ensure any gaps are quickly addressed. There is a good range of suitable toys and resources to support children's play and learning.
- The childminder talks about how she would manage children's behaviour positively and encourage respect for her home and the boundaries in place. She feels it is important for children to learn how to be kind to others and know how to share resources and take turns. The childminder acknowledges the importance of praising children for their achievements.
- Through discussion, the childminder explains how she would promote a healthy lifestyle through exercise, play and the foods children eat. This includes providing a healthy diet, reading story books and regular visits to the park.
- The childminder understands the benefits of working closely with parents to meet children's needs. She discusses how she gathers information from parents about their children when they first start to help them settle. She discusses how she regularly shares information through resources, such as a written learning journal and online applications.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
