## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider describes how staff will plan activities based on children's interests. She explains staff provide a wide range of varied resources and games to help children stay engaged and complement the seven areas of learning. She discusses that staff will work closely with the school to complement children's learning and help them to gain future skills.
- The provider is aware of her role to safeguard children. She explains how she will support staff to keep their safeguarding knowledge up to date, by attending regular training. She explains training ensures staff are aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse, including radical and extreme views and behaviours and how to refer safeguarding concerns. The provider is familiar with local safeguarding partnership procedures.
- The provider understands the need to evaluate the provision. She explains how she supports staff to complete mandatory training and conduct their own online research and have staff meetings, to keep their knowledge up to date.
- The provider understands how to ensure the premises are suitable for children who attend the club. There are a wide range of policies, procedures and risk assessments help staff ensure the premises are safe and secure for children to use. She describes how staff will risk assess each area and adapt activities to meet the needs of the individual children who attend the club.
- The provider understands the importance of ensuring staff have high expectations for children's behaviour. She is clear about how staff will be calm, respectful and are trained to manage a variety of behaviours to help children to develop positive relationships.
- The provider understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating, being physically active and spending time outdoors in the playground.
- The provider understands the importance of developing close partnerships with parents and other professionals. She describes how staff would share information with parents at pick up. She explains she will have meetings with other professionals to support the children who require further additional support.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector took a tour around the building and had a discussion with the provider about the organisation of the room and checked the suitability of equipment resources available.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the public liability insurance.
- The inspector verified evidence of suitability for the staff and the adults working and on the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
